

S.C. World History

Curriculum:

This course will serve as an introduction to the earliest history of the world. Students will study the history of the world from Stone-Age man through the beginnings of the Roman Empire. The correlation between geographic locations and world cultures will be explored.

Students will track the significant events in world history by creating a time line. Major areas of study will include;

- Pre-history to stone-age man. Prehistory-3000 B.C.
- First Civilizations of Africa and Asia 3200 B.C.-500 B.C.
 1. Egypt and the Ancient Kingdoms of the Nile
 2. City-States of Ancient Sumer
 3. Mesopotamia and the civilizations of the region
- Early Civilizations in India and China 2500 B.C.-256 B.C.
 1. Cities of the Indus Valley
 2. Kingdoms of the Ganges
 3. Early Civilization in China
- Ancient Greece 1750 B.C.-133 B.C.
 1. Early People of the Aegean
 2. The Ancient City-States
- Ancient Rome and the Rise of Christianity 509 B.C.-A.D. 476
 1. From Republic to Empire
 2. The Roman Achievements

You will choose a project that is interesting to you from our curriculum each quarter. A list of suggested projects will be given to you. You are encouraged to be creative, and may develop your own ideas. Your project will be a major part of your grade. You will also be graded on your success in the following areas;
